

WEEK 10: Youth Work, Nigeria (4th - 10th July)

The CDMF Youth Centre in Muchalla provides a hostel facility, mentoring, discipleship and academic support for students in the government secondary school which serves many of the villages in the Mubi hills.

1. Thank God for the impact the Youth Centre in Muchalla has had on the lives of Fali students who have passed through it in the past ten years.
2. Thank God that in spite of the crises of the insurgency, our hope to further this ministry to Fali youth is kept alive.
3. We fear that many parents from the Fali hills may hesitate in releasing their children back to school for fear of Boko Haram. Pray that as the schools are being re-opened, students will resume to school in Muchalla again.
4. Pray for Mathias Vulo for more grace of God as he works among the youth; that a generation of global vision disciples will be born.
5. Pray for more youth workers, especially those who can provide academic support for the students and are able to keep the centre attractive to young people; short term volunteers would be of great help.
6. Ask the Lord for funds to maintain the hostel and fellowship structures.

WEEK 11: Central Africa Missions Outreach (CAMO) (11th - 17th July)

CAMO is the project name for our mission to the Central Africa sub-region of Africa. Our vision is that by the year 2025, every single unreached people group in this region would have been engaged by a missionary team. There are 8 countries in this region namely Chad, Cameroon, Central Afric Republic, South Sudan, Congo (Brazzavile), Equatorial Guinea and Sao Tome & Principe. These countries have deep spiritual needs that seem not to be in the limelight of missions efforts. We engage the countries in two phases viz Phase I (2012 – 2017) the first 4 countries. Phase II (2018 – 2025) the last 4 countries. We are currently actively involved in Phase I of the CAMO vision.

1. Five of the eight CAMO countries are French speaking. Pray for CDMF's effort to provide a French mission school in Chad, that this will be a major recruiting and training ground for potential missionaries into the CAMO thrust.
 2. Pray for peace and an end to the wars in CAR and South Sudan so that doors that have been shut for ministry can be re-opened to engage unreached tribes in these countries
 3. Pray for an increase in skilled hands to join the missions work force so that these countries can be effectively engaged. Some of these nations have a very high illiteracy rates and will need innovative approaches to run ministry within the nations.
 4. Ask God for acceptance within the existing churches in those countries for discipleship and effective mobilization to reach the unreached within their borders.
 5. Join us pray and trust God for funds to finance pioneer missions into these countries, particularly to cover travel, research and relocation costs.
 6. Ask God for favours from the governments of these countries as we begin to relate with them

WEEK 12: Cameroon (18th - 24th July)

1. The Bana Tribe was the first people group we engaged in Cameroon. Pray that as the churches among the Bana people transition into full indigenous leadership while the missionaries gradually move up to newer tribes, there will be stability and growth of the Gospel among the tribe.
2. Naphtali & Debora Richard presently lead the Cameroon team. Continue to uplift them to God in prayers for wisdom and skills to lead and grow the work in that country and to reach even more unreached tribes with the Gospel.
3. The Cameroon national office has been trying to relocate to a more strategic city, but since the increase in Boko Haram activity in Nigeria, stricter measures have been put especially against organizations with Nigerian origins. This has slowed down the process. Join us pray for divine favour before the Cameroonian government.
4. Pray that the borders of Nigeria with Cameroon will once again be freely open. With the borders closed, travel costs are extremely high since we can't travel by road again to countries in the Central African region.
5. Research and preparations has been going on to engage the Kapsiki tribe with the Gospel before the end of 2015. Ask God to still make this vision possible this year and to provide all the needed resources, manpower and connections needed to take the Gospel into this dark tribe.
6. We envision Cameroon to play a very strategic role in the CAMO vision. Cameroon alone shares borders with five of the eight CAMO countries. Ask God to give us clarity on how to most strategically utilize this country to reach the others.

WEEK 13: Mobilization and Recruitment (25th - 31st July)

1. Pray for David and Elizabeth Ogunshola who serve as CDMF mobilization staff in Uyo Nigeria for more of God's grace upon their lives to be able to know exactly what to do and how to run this ministry
2. Pray for wisdom and open doors for them to be able to raise more support and prayer partners for the ministry
3. Ask God for the needed grace to attract funds to support the various projects on the fields.
4. The Mobilization office needs staff to assist with media & graphics, publications and to help out in mobilization tours & exhibitions. Pray for God to send us volunteers or provide funds to pay hired staff, and that God should give us the right

5. Pray for David as he travels between the fields and as within the country to share the needs on the fields with churches and partners, that God should continue to keep and protect him.
6. Pray for provision to meet both their direct ministry needs and their family needs.

WEEK 14: Missionary Kids and Families (1st - 7th August)

1. Pray for missionary families who are relocating to new countries and cultures that God will give the grace for adaptation especially for wives and children.
2. Pray for the education of missionary kids (MKs) who have to change schools and in some cases change curriculums, that God will release divine wisdom on them.
3. Pray for the kids who are at points in their lives when they are needing to make major choices and decisions, that God will give them guidance and wisdom.
4. Pray that none of these MKs will get lost to the many schemes of the devil, but that they will grow to themselves become arrows in God's hands to reach Nations
5. Pray for provision of funds for the education of Mks (preschool through tertiary)

WEEK 15: CDMF International Office (8th - 14th August)

1. Thank God for His protection since we moved the office to Ibadan; especially on journeys made to Mubi when it was dangerous to travel.
2. Pray for God's guidance on the General Coordinator and for sensitivity to His Spirit, as they provide guidance on how best to reach the nations the ministry labours in.
3. Pray that this year 2015 our year of “double portion of anointing from God”, will be true and evident to all CDMF stakeholders: partners, team members and church members.
4. Pray for quick restoration of banking, education and other services in Mubi and other towns in the North East, so as to facilitate movement of finances of resources to the brethren and for ongoing projects.
5. Pray for the success of the short term missions trainings that go on at the International Office in Ibadan. A 4 week preparatory course for ASCEND (short term missions) is presently being hosted and run at the IO.
6. Join us to ask the Lord to provide conducive environment for the IO to meet all our needs of training, retreats and offices.

WEEK 16: Partners and Supporters (15th -21st August)

1. This year CDMF clocks 30 years of reaching the unreached. Over these years, God has blessed us with individual partners and supporters who have made it possible for us to remain on the mission fields rescuing the unreached. Join us thank God for everyone in this category.
2. Pray for everyone who has supported this work in many different ways, that God will continually reward their labours of love.
3. Many of our supporters have needs they have been trusting God to meet over the years. Join us lift them up to God that they will be remembered this season with God's miracles.
4. Pray also for other ministries and agencies working to reach the unreached with whom we work from time to time, that God will keep these doors of partnerships open and help us to jointly achieve more for His kingdom.
5. Pray for the leadership of churches and support agencies that have partnered with us over the years, for God to increase them and multiply their relevance and impact in all that they do, and for the growth of their churches and ministries.

WEEK 17: The Global Mission Field (22nd - 28th August)

1. Thank God for the numerous missions agencies and independent missionaries working around the world to fulfil the Great Commission
2. Pray for the over 5,000 unreached people groups within the 10/40 window who have little or no access to the Gospel. Ask God to send labourers into these harvest fields
3. Thank God for the efforts of the Nigerian Church through Vision5015. Ask God that this project will become a reality and the Islamic nations of Africa and the Middle East will see the light of the Gospel. (Vision5015 is the Nigerian Church's collective project to raise 50,000 missionaries and send 15,000 of them to 31 core Islamic countries of Africa and the ME within 15 years).
4. Pray for the Nigeria Evangelical Missions Association (NEMA) which brings together all missions agencies in Nigeria. Ask God that NEMA will continue to foster unity and coordinate strategy to reach the world from Nigeria.
5. Pray for comfort and courage for missionaries labouring in difficult areas, amidst terrorism, insurgency and persecution, particularly for the families of missionaries who have been slain at their duty posts.
6. Ask God that in this generation, the whole world will hear the Gospel of Jesus.

“If you spend 10 minutes daily praying for missions, In one year, you would have prayed for over 60 hours. That's more than 2 and half days. Start praying today.”



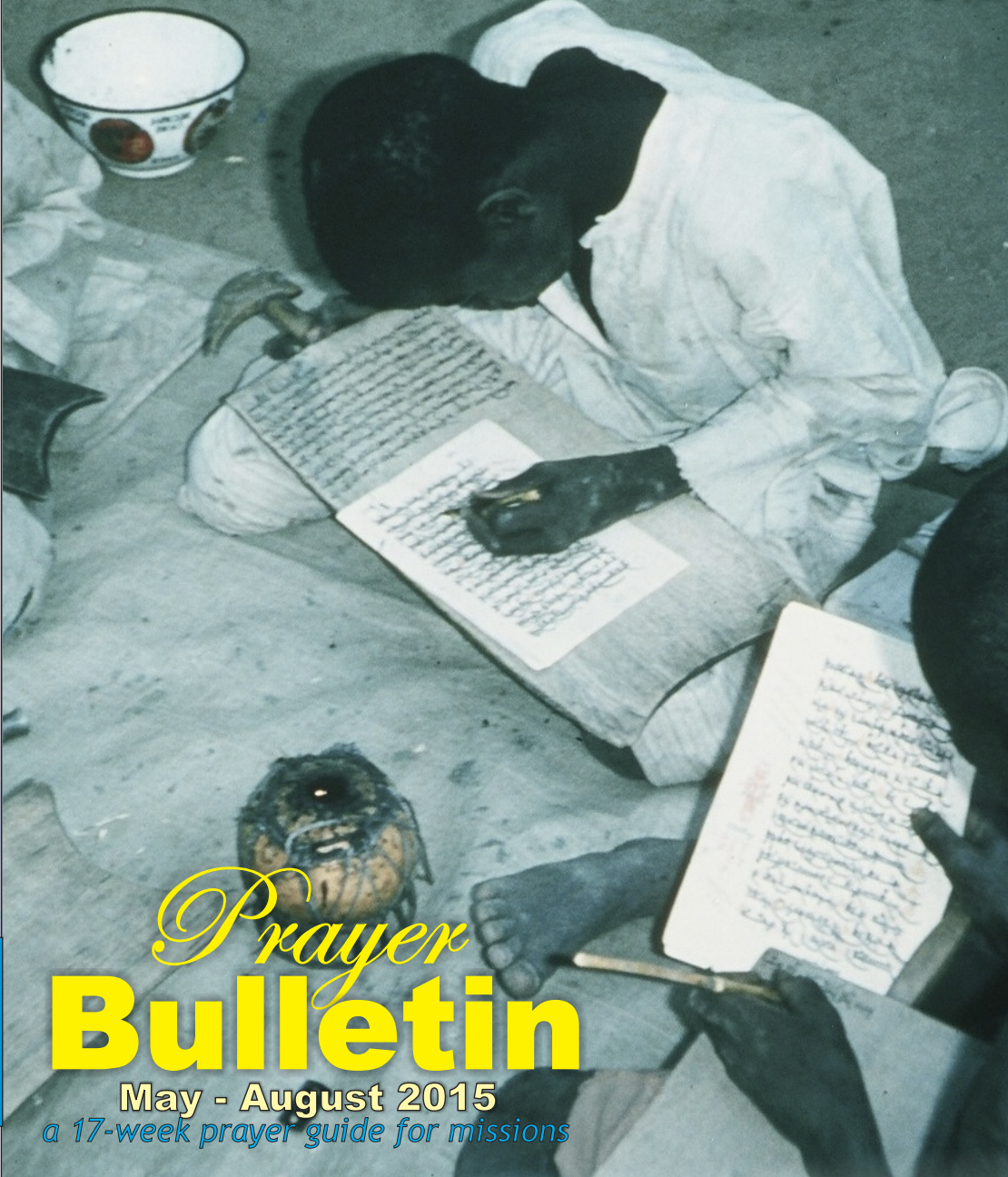

WE ARE WELL EQUIPPED FOR THE BATTLE

“For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds; casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;” 2 Corinthians 10:4-5.

In the spiritual battle of winning souls and establishing them in the Kingdom of God, we need to continually remind ourselves of the fact that **we are able** to achieve our aim, and deliver the captives of the hosts of darkness back under the Lordship of the Lord Jesus Christ. How? He who called us to battle did not send us out empty handed. He gave us means with which to get the victory in that battle:

- The Holy Spirit's Power—the indispensable factor. Acts 1:8
- Authority, power over Satan's power. Luke 10:19; Mathew 28:18-20.
- The name of Jesus, to subdue every force that opposes us in our rescue mission. Phil 2:9-11.

It is a settled fact that the Lord Jesus, through the shedding of His blood on the cross has reconciled all things back to God (Col1:20; 2:15). This Peace is ours to enforce by using the weapons of our warfare effectively. The Lord gave us the secret of using the power and authority He gave us.

- *“And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayer and requests ...” Ephesians 6:18*
- *“...they should always pray and not give up” Luke 18:1*

Jesus in His temptation in the wilderness (Luke 4:1-13), showed us that the power in the Word of God is beyond claiming promises for our well being. We can use the Word to assert our victory and do battle in spiritual realms to liberate souls. Our victory in the end time harvest of the nations and establishing them in the Kingdom of God is tied up with our ability to 'pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests' and 'not giving up', even in the face of odds and delays. Even in doing these, ability is 'through God'.

Therefore let us pray with confidence that we have all our petitions granted, and with the expectation of seeing Jesus Christ established as Lord and God glorified, in all the nations and issues raised in prayer.

WHO WE ARE & WHAT WE DO

Christ’s Disciples’ Missionary Foundation is a non-profit missions organization committed to taking the Gospel of Jesus to the unreached. Wherever they may be; in their villages, hamlets, towns, and cities; with or without civilization, on mountains, valleys and riversides. We are called to make sure everybody has a chance to hear about Jesus. We are involved in Church planting among unreached people groups, discipleship, indigenous leadership development, and community development leading to holistic transformation.

WEEK 1: Thank God with us (2nd - 8th May)

Psalm 115:1- Not to us, O Lord, not to us. But to Your great Name be the glory, Because of Your love and faithfulness.

1. Join us praise the Lord for His great love and faithfulness shown to us, to our brethren and to His work to date. 2015 marks our 30th year as CDMF reaching the unreached. Appreciate God who is the Eternal Rock and in whom alone is uprightness and justice (Deut 32:4).

2. Thank God for how He has sustained His work in Christ's Disciples' Missionary Foundation for these thirty years.

3. Thank Him for preserving the lives of His children and sustaining us throughout the crises of the Boko Haram (BH) insurgency in Northern Nigeria; and we trust that He will continue to do same.

4. Thank God for all the missionaries and pastors in the various fields, for His enabling grace on all their ministries and families.

5. Appreciate the Lord for our prayer partners and financial supporters who have continued to pray and give sacrificially for the furtherance of the Gospel of the Kingdom.

6. Thank God for restoring normalcy gradually to Mubi and its environs; for comforting His people and for giving them strength to start afresh in some cases

WEEK 2: Healing, Restoration and Rebuilding of a Church in ruins (9th - 15th May)

Ezekiel 36:33-36—“Thus says the Lord God: On the day that I cleanse you from all your iniquities, I will cause the cities to be inhabited, and the waste places shall be rebuilt...Then the nations...shall know that I am the Lord; I have rebuilt the ruined places and replanted that which was desolate. I am the Lord; I have spoken, and I will do it.”

1. Even though they killed and destroyed Church buildings and properties, the faith of majority of God's people is indestructible. We are as gold refined in the fire. Pray for the restoration of all that was lost in Mubi and the North East of Nigeria in general through terrorist and insurgent activities.

2. Ask for comfort of the Holy Spirit for the bereaved and divine intervention for the rehabilitation of the now displaced, homeless and jobless.

3. Pray for restoration and provision to rebuild the ruins of church buildings and properties of Christian destroyed by the jihadists.

4. Ask the Lord to heal the wounds of the Church in the North East of Nigeria supernaturally. Pray that the people of God be able to forgive from their hearts those who have done these evil things against them.

5. Ask the Lord to give the remnants of the insurgents and their allies, hearts of flesh in place of their stony hearts (Ezekiel 36:26), and bless them with salvation in Christ Jesus.

6. Pray that the Lord will turn the hearts of all Muslims to seek the peace which only Jesus Christ gives. Pray for mass conversion of these ones in each of the towns and villages of the North East.

7. Plead for the restoration of some church goers who went back to seek protective charms against Boko Haram attacks. Our God is a God of forgiveness and restoration.

WEEK 3: Churches in Mubi Hills (16th - 22nd May)

Phil 1:6 Being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the day of Jesus Christ;

1. Join us in thanking God for upholding the disciples and churches among the Fali and Higgi on Mubi Hills. Despite the insurgency in nearby towns and villages, many churches still remained.
2. Pray for each of the Churches in the Mubi hills and for those who labour among them, both missionaries and local pastors. The churches are under listed:

Col 1:9-11: that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy;

- a. Julvu People: [**Churches:** Madivi, Lila, Gilmari]
- b. Mijulu People: [Gubi church]
- c. Mukta People: [**Churches:** Lainde, Thuba, Mudi]
- d. Zah/Sna People [**Churches:** Drange, Whate, Karlugwe, Amsa]
- e. Muchalla [The youth Centre]

3. Pray that the youth of Mubi Hills will be focussed on the Lord and give themselves for the Great Commission. Ask the Lord to give them victory over distractions and the lure of city life.

4. Ask the Lord to further equip the labour force in Mubi Hills and provide for them.

WEEK 4: The Nzanyi People (23rd - 29th May)

John 8:12 - Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."

John 10:9 - I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture.

1. Pray that the Nzanyi people (of Maiha Area in Adamawa state) who have remained predominantly Muslim, will respond to the light of Christ. Ask the Lord to remove the veil that covers their hearts today.
2. Dislodge in prayer the strongholds that have held this people group bound. Ask that they be liberated to see the Light and recognize He who is the only way of salvation.
3. Pray for the Nzanyi believers to be given more grace and boldness by the Holy Spirit to reach out to their tribesmen and women.

4. Pray for revival and renewed zeal to holistically engage the people group for transformation. Pray against fatigue and discouragement among Missionaries and Pastors in the land who seem to have laboured for long.

5. Ask the Lord to send more labourers to CDMF for the Nzanyi thrust.

6. Pray for Polycarp David and his family for wisdom as he leads the work among the Nzanyi.

7. Intercede for the following Nzanyi communities—for the blotting out of all Satanic covenants that hinder the indigenes from embracing the Light of Christ (Colossians 2:13-15) : Mayo Nguli, Maiha, Pakka, Hubare and environs.

WEEK 5: The Kilba (30th May - 5th June)

The Kilba tribe is one of the major tribes in Adamawa State of Nigeria. They are found mostly in the Hong area. CDMF has a church in Mijili among the Kilba, and this church has today sent out missionaries working among other tribes.

Psalm 127:1, 3-4.

Unless the LORD builds the house, They labour in vain who build it; Unless the LORD guards the city, The watchman stays awake in vain... Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, The fruit of the womb is a reward. Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, So are the children of one's youth.

1. As we thank God for the work of the Holy Spirit in the lives of our Kilba brethren, we need at this time to commit them to the Lord for safe keeping. The Boko Haram insurgency took its toll on them; many ran away from their homes to seek refuge in safer places.

2. Ask the Lord to resettle them and as they return home, and to restore confidence in them.

3. Pray that they will more than before, evangelize their surroundings and ask that the burden to win souls will be ignited in them.

4. Pray that many of them will be arrows in the hands of God to target and reach out to unreached peoples in Nigeria, Cameroun and Chad. That the Lord will raise and send out more missionaries from the Mijili church and other Kilba towns.

5. Pray particularly for the Mijili Church to be strengthened, united and watched over especially by God; that they continue to provide leadership for other churches in the area.

6. Commit Mike and Mercy Daniel who lead the church in Mijili and the other brethren unto God. Pray that they will serve God according to His rules (2 Timothy 2:4-5).

WEEK 6: Republic of Chad (6th - 12th June)

1. Thank God for the open doors we enjoy in Chad and for what He is doing in this country — reaching the unreached and raising workers for the thrust.

2. Pray for missionaries at the frontiers in Chad that they be strengthened continually by God in the inner man, and be enabled to serve Him acceptably and be fruitful in all their labours.

3. Augustin and Diane Longa lead the work of CDMF in the French speaking Africa. Pray for more grace, wisdom and fullness of the Spirit for them as Chad is presently the hub of our work in that region.

4. Ask the Lord to send missionary volunteers willing to serve in CELSI (Centre for Languages and Social Integration) in Doba; majorly English and Computer teachers are in short supply.

5. Sis Virginie Nana presently anchors the work at CELSI. Ask God for wisdom, unction, and strength to use this centre as tool to touch lives and share the Gospel.

6. Pray for provision of funds to build a block of 3 rooms to accommodate volunteers and facilitators at CELSI in Doba. The building and accessories is estimated at 1,800,000 CFA (about 3,200 USD).

7. Pray for Doba in southern Chad and the tribes around it (Gor, Nangda, Mongo), that the team in Doba will be enabled to effectively reach them.

8. Ask that the church in Bodo (Gor) receives a reviving rain from heaven. Pray for Pastor Moussa the indeginous leader of that church, that he be strengthened with might in his inner man so as to understand all that God intends for him and the people of Bodo and to be an effective leader model for the upcoming converts. (Ephesians 3:16-19).

9. CDMF's Francophone Missionary Equipment Centre runs the 6 months Basic Seminars in Frontier Missions (BSFM) in Doba every year and a Portable Bible School for pastors in different locations. This provides missionary training for indigenous and French speaking workers. Please pray for:

- Abraham and Sarah Kaigama who are the resident trainers and their children; ask that they will be well received by the local churches in the city and for their children's integration into the Chadian school system.
- Funds to expand the current campus to accommodate more students for the second set of this programme which runs July – December yearly.
- Safety and grace for visiting facilitators from different fields and countries who will be impacting the students.
- Provision to meet needs for infrastructure and recurrent needs of the BSFM. The ministry offers 50% scholarship to all students to help them meet up with their feeding, training resources and other upkeep bills.
- Pray that God will continually send students whose hearts are ready to serve Him who will receive adequate training and guidance through the BSFM.

WEEK 7: The Hadjaraye People (Chad) (13th - 19th June)

The Hadjaraye is a cluster of about 25 people groups comprising of over 1250 communities and settlements. Only about 50 of them have a church or cell group that meets. They are found around the middle belt of Chad with a great potential for workers who can reach the north of Chad. But these souls are yet perishing with no labourers to reach them. Barka Tchere and his wife work as CDMF missionaries among the Hadjaraye in Chad

1. Pray for Barka and his wife for fruitful labour among different communities of the Hadjaraye; that they be shielded and continually refreshed by God Himself.

2. The Hadjaraye is a field filled with power encounters and confrontations as Islam tries to gain a foothold among the people. Ask God that His servants works and words will be backed up with signs, wonders and power.

3. Ask the Lord to provide all they need for the work. Barka needs a strong motorcycle, and provision to cover his constant travel, housing and family costs.

4. Ask the Lord to help Barka to raise teams of indigenous workers who can be trained and sent into other communities among the same people.

5. Pray for missionaries to be sent to join the small team in this vast field.

WEEK 8: The Ruto People (20th - 26th June)

The Ruto are an unreached people group of Egyptian origin who are now found in three countries: Central Africa Republic, Chad and South Sudan. We have a team working to reach the Ruto, but at the moment only work among the ones in southern Chad while waiting for peace to return in the two other countries.

1. The Ruto is a tribe with nearly no access to modern civilization/development. Pray for holistic transformation in their communities (spiritual, physical, environmental and social)

2. Timothy Nadjidoroum and his family live and work among the Ruto. Pray for unction, wisdom and strength to be fruitful in their labour among the Ruto. Timothy is a Chadian indigenous missionary.

3. Pray for the newest members of the Ruto team: Isidor & Evelyn Ngabra (with their family) and Romeo Dibamou that their entry and adaptation will be with ease and that God will give them acceptance in their new community

4. Our immediate projects among the Ruto is water. Our team plans to dig 3 wells in 3 Ruto villages before the end of October 2015. Please pray for individuals who will finance these projects. Each well costs about (USD:)

WEEK 9: CDMF Missions Base, Mubi (27th June - 3rd July)

The CDMF secretariat in Mubi is where our work in North-Eastern Nigeria is coordinated from. It houses our mission base, DMTI campus, missions guest house/rest home and our conference centre.

1. Thank the Lord for sparing the premises from destruction by the Boko Haram terrorists who captured the town in 2014. This favour by God only indicates that He has more things to accomplish through the secretariat.

2. Pray that this compound will be continually preserved by God to fulfill His purposes.

3. Pray for the administrative staff and all others who work and reside here for foresight, wisdom and grace to maintain the work there and for continuous protection.

4. We now operate a chapel within the secretariat facility. Please pray that we will through this reach out to the community around us and be a missionary sending fellowship.

Discipleship and Missionary Training Institute

DMTI is the training arm of CDMF. We run a one year missions preparation training school at our secretariat campus in Mubi, Adamawa State.

1. Thank God for what He has been doing through DMTI these past years; preparing men and women for active missionary service.

2. Pray for all DMTI Alumni, that they will continue to be worthy ambassadors and faithful disciplers in all their fields where they serve.

3. Pray that the Lord will always send selected called out ones to enrol in DMTI, thereby adding more well prepared men and women to the work force on the global mission fields.

4. Ask the Lord to continually equip the trainers and facilitators and enable them to produce well equipped labourers.

5. Join us in asking the Great Provider and Lord of the Harvest to supply funds and materials for effective running of the DMTI.

6. Pray for Jared & Helen Irmiya, and Amaya Samaila as they work as resident trainers at the DMTI campus in Mubi Nigeria.
